

BUSINESS CLASSIFICATIONS FOR GOVERNMENT REPORTING:

Small Business (SB)

A concern that is independently owned and operated, not dominant in the field of operations which it is bidding on government contracts, and qualified as a small business under the criteria and size standards in 13 CFR part 121 (see FAR 19.102). The size for manufacturers is determined by the number of employees of the concern and its affiliates. The size for nonmanufacturers is determined by the volume of receipts. Generally speaking, a small business has less than 500 employees including all of its affiliates.

Small Disadvantaged Business (SDB) – Must be SBA Certified to check this

A small business that has received certification as a small disadvantaged business consistent with 13 CFR part 124, sub-part B. The net worth of each individual upon who the certification is based may not exceed \$750,000 after taking into account the allowed exclusions. It is listed, on the date of its representation, on the register of small disadvantaged business concerns maintained by the Small Business Administration.

Women-Owned Small Business (WOSB) (FAR 19.001)

A small business that is at least 51 percent owned by one or more women, or in the case of any publicly owned business, at least 51 percent of the stock is owned by one or more women; and the management and daily business operations are controlled by one or more women.

Veteran-Owned Small Business (VOSB)

A small business that is at least 51 percent owned by one or more veterans, or in the case of any publicly owned business, not less than 51 percent of the stock is owned by one or more veterans; and the management and daily business operations are controlled by one or more veterans, “Veteran” has the meaning given the term in section 101(2) of title 38, United States Code.

Service-Disabled Veteran-Owned Small Business (SDVOSB)

A small business that is at least 51 percent owned by one or more service-disabled veterans or, in the case of any publicly owned business, not less than 51 percent of the stock is owned by one or more service-disabled veterans, and the management and daily business operations are controlled by one or more service-disabled veterans, or in the case of a veteran with permanent and severe disability, the spouse or permanent caregiver of such veteran, “Service-disabled veteran” means a veteran with a disability that is service-connected, as defined in section 101(16) of title 38, United States Code.

Hubzone (Public Law 105-135) (HUBZ) – Must be SBA Certified to check this

A historically underutilized business zone, which is in an area located within one or more qualified census tracts, qualified non-metropolitan counties, or lands within the external boundaries of an Indian Reservation.
